

Understanding the World The children will be learning that changes have occurred over time. The children will learn about past and present events in the lives of family members. They will investigate similarities and differences between themselves and others. They will also investigate the similarities and differences in places, animals, plants and objects. We will learn about features in our immediate environment and how environments may vary. The children will be encouraged to make observations of things they have seen. We will learn about how technology is used at home and at school and about different types of technology. The children will be able to use a range of different technology, including Bee-bots, cameras and iPads. **Expressive Arts and Design** The children will complete lots of art and craft activities to do with our topics. They will also have lots of opportunities to sing songs, make music and dance. They will be able to use lots of different resources and materials to make paintings, drawings, models and collages. We will learn about mixing colours and the children will be able to experiment with this. The children will also be given lots of opportunities to take part in role-play activities and will be involved in setting up a role-play area. **Physical Development** The children will be learning football skills with a coach from Sunderland. The children will continue to develop their fine motor skills through things like cutting, threading beads and drawing. They will work on their gross motor skills through PE lessons, where we will be doing throwing, jumping and running, and also when playing in our outside area. We will be looking at things we can do to be healthy and will be learning about the importance of healthy eating, sleep and exercise. RE Children will learn about holy days and that Pentecost is a holy day when Christians celebrate the gifts of the Holy Spirit. They will also learn about the meaning of reconciliation, and that we have choice, and that God helps us to choose well and to be sorry, and that God forgives us. Finally, they will learn that the Church is universal, and that everyone is our neighbour and is loved by God. Thank you for the support you give your child at home. It is so important that you hear your child read every night, even if it just for a few minutes. Please can you also make sure that they have their sound and word pack in school every day and have been practising with them. The children also need to be able to read and spell the tricky words which are in the pack and your help with this is so The children use lots of different resources for all the activities that we do. We try to include cooking activities regularly and also make play dough on a weekly basis. We are therefore going to start a baking fund and would be very grateful if you could send money into school to contribute to this.
