<u>English</u>

Adventure and Mystery Stories - We will read and analyse a range of adventure and mystery stories by different authors and use these examples to write their own stories.

Explanation Reports - Children will use their topic research to write an explanation report about how Tutankhamen died.

<u>Maths</u>

Maths lessons will be based on teaching the knowledge, skills and understanding outlined in the National Curriculum.

During Mathematics this term we will be working on a variety of skills such as rounding numbers, the four operations $(+, -,x, \div)$, word problems involving time, measures and money, fractions of shapes and numbers, properties of 3D shapes, symmetry, temperature, bar charts, collecting data, Carroll diagrams, converting measures, reflecting shapes and angles. Lots of **times tables** practice and weekly mental maths tests.

Science—Taught by Mrs Bottoms

We have continued forces particularly focusing on magnets, their uses and investigative work testing the strength of magnets. We will also be doing investigative work around sound and materials (states of matter - solids, liquids and gases). After half term will be Rocks which will include comparing and grouping rocks based on appearance physical properties; describing how fossils are formed; how soils are partly made from rocks and investigative work around those things.

Ancient Egypt

Spring Term Topic Web



History

We will be investigating why the Ancient Egyptians built the pyramids. The children will undertake a lot of research projects using a variety of sources, including books and specially chosen websites. We will discuss the reliability of these sources and investigate why the information may be slightly different. We will also be looking at the processes and reasons why mummies were created.

Geography

Use atlases, maps (digital) and globes to locate the continents and oceans of the world. We will focus on the countries of Europe before looking at a region in France in more detail. We will be looking at the geographical features of the country as well as investigating the importance of a region. The importance of tourism to a region.

Pyramids - the children will be investigating pyramids and building their own examples. They will think about how to strengthen their structure and how to successfully join the different parts together.
