Frequently Asked Questions

Why should I send my child there?

We have caring staff who offer personal teaching for all children,, no matter what their ability is.

We have large, spacious grounds, including outdoor fitness equipment, easy access to the park and woodland.

Does my child have to be Roman Catholic?

We welcome children of all faiths and none. All children are taught to care for themselves and others and to treat everyone with respect. They are at the heart of what we do.

Will my child feel safe?

Yes. Bullying is not tolerated at all. To show our commitment to this we are currently involved in creating an Antibullying charter.

We also take the mental health of our children very seriously and have a counsellor who works with some children.

Will they have the same opportunities as children in a bigger school?

We have small class sizes so our staff know each child as individuals, not as a number or part of a group. We are family friendly and like one big family.

All children are given opportunities to join teams, clubs and different councils, including RRSA and school council. Our children have a voice because to us, Every Child Matters.

All children from years 2-6 are given the opportunity to learn a musical instrument for free.

How will you support me?

We offer a daily Breakfast Club, including fitness or sporting activities twice a week.

We offer regular after school clubs, including music, PE, drama and craft, most of which are free.

We have monthly newsletters to keep you informed about what is happening in school.

Staff are always willing to speak to you if you have any concerns about your child.

Where will my child go next?
