Good luck to all of our children who are taking part in sports events during the rest of this term.




Parental Questionnaire Results

Summer Sun!

Please can I remind you to protect your child from the sun? On sunny days all children should have sun cream put onto them before they come to school and should have a sun hat with them, with their name clearly marked inside the hat.



<u>Medication Authorisation</u>—Under the direction of Public Health England and Durham County Council, we have been advised we can keep our own supply of prescribed medicines in school: Calpol, Paracetamol, Sting Cream, and Piriton. This is to help children have full access to education, play a full and active role in school life, remain healthy and achieve academic goals. Forms have been sent out to all parents, with an authorisation slip to be signed and returned to school.

Water Safety Advice— How to keep your child safe this summer:

Jumping into rivers without acclimatising can kill.

Being suddenly immersed in cold water can cause you to have a heart attack and die. The change in temperature can also lead to a gasp response where you could breathe in water, get into a panic and drown.

Drowning is one of the major causes of adolescent deaths worldwide. An estimated 57,000 ten to nineteen-year -olds drowned across the globe in 2015 – two thirds of them boys.

Fourteen year old Cameron Gosling never came home after jumping into the river without acclimatising, while playing with friends one sunny day. The lives of those closest to him will never be the same again.

His family has no routine or structure and his brother goes to sleep every night listening to Cameron's funeral music.

Some of his friends have been taken out of mainstream school, friendships have suffered and there have even been thoughts of suicide.

Cameron's mum Fiona has been left wishing she had spoken to her son about 'cold water shock,' believing he would still be here if they had had that chat.

Do your children know about the dangers of jumping into rivers? Do you?

Please learn about cold water shock and have the conversation with your children that Fiona will forever regret not having with Cameron.
